Greetings,

We have just completed our fourth year helping students from K-12 at Tipp City Schools, and hopefully improving their STEM related educational experience. What an exceptional year it has been – our best yet. Efforts to involve more students, the community and the school district have really been paying off in many ways.

Our most successful student program, the THS & TMS Science Fair was hitting on all cylinders this year. Ten students went to the State Science Day, with nine receiving Superiors, both buildings received a State award for outstanding school (only six other trophies were awarded in Ohio), and one student was selected to represent our seven county district at the International Science & Engineering Fair in San Jose, California. Several students earned additional special awards or scholarships at District and State. To encourage and support continued student interest and success in this program, STEAM will be conducting a science fair project course through Tipp Monroe Community Services this Fall. Watch for more information in the TMCS Fall Flier due out next month. In addition, we are looking for special category award sponsors. Any business or individual interested in participating, please let me know. We think it is important to recognize these students' hard work and achievements. Thanks also for continued support from Tipp City Rotary and Tipp Monroe Optimists.

The LEGO (FLL) Robotics Program in Tipp City is also growing. Last season we had only a couple of teams participate and compete, while an effort to organize a long term approach to training and retaining coaches and parents was underway. Thanks to the efforts of Chuck Smith, David Gaier, John Kronour, and the Board of Education, a solution is at hand. Beginning with the 2010 FLL season the school will fund a Robotic Coordinator position. This person will organize teams and train coaches and parents, guiding them through the project development and competition process. Hopefully this will keep students in the program for multiple years as they advance to higher levels of robotics competition. Several FLL and Jr.FFL teams are already registered.

As a result of community support, we were once again able to fund a number of school programs and purchases, including the TMS Math Counts competition, Robotics Teams, Family Math & Science Night at Broadway and Nevin Coppock, and the Science Fair Program. Thanks to DARE Electronics and Tipp City VFW Post 4615 for their support. We were also able to award a \$500 STEM scholarship to a highly qualified THS senior, Ms. Briana Schultz. Thanks to those supporting the Hickory River Scholarship Fundraiser.

Our upcoming year will see a great increase in programs funded thanks to several recent corporate sponsorships. The companies are Emerson Climate Technologies, \$2500; A.O.Smith Foundation, Inc., \$2000; and Goodrich Corp., \$500. We are extremely appreciative of this support and hope that more STEM related companies in the Tipp City area will see the value of aiding in the education of their potential future employees.

2010 Tipp City Schools Science Fair Results

On Thursday, February 18, 2010, the Tipp City Schools held their 6th Annual Science Fair for students in grades 6-12. This event offered students a venue that promotes the development of creative thinking, research and writing skills and career motivation toward the sciences, all in one program. Tippecanoe Middle School and High School students completed and exhibited projects in biology, chemistry, botany, space & earth sciences, computers, zoology, microbiology, biochemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics, medicine & health and behavioral & social science.

The 2010 Tippecanoe Science Fair was held at the Tippecanoe High School where 17 students received a “Superior” rating on their project and are eligible to go to the District contest held at Central State University on March 20th. Students receiving a superior at District may go on to the State contest held at The Ohio State University in May.

Among those students receiving “superior” ratings, eight were given special awards for their high scores; from Tippecanoe Middle School: Kyla Jones, Sammie Rowland, and Elizabeth Walker; from Tippecanoe High School: Alexandra Abboud, Andrew Abboud, Steven Chaney, Alexandra Robbins, and Briana Schultz, with Andrew Abboud, Sammie Rowland and Brianna Schultz receiving perfect scores of 40/40 points.

Event sponsors donated awards and gift certificates in the amount of over \$1200, including \$500 donated by the Tipp City Rotary International club to pay for the District Science Fair registration fees. District Science Day Report

Fourteen Tippecanoe High School & Middle School students competed in the Ohio Academy of Science, West District Science Day, held at Central State University, Wilberforce, Ohio on Saturday, March 20, 2010. More than 450 students from seven counties participated in the all day event. Students exhibited projects in science, technology, engineering and mathematics which they worked on from September through February of this year.

All Tippecanoe students who received a superior rating at the Tipp City Schools Science Fair in February were eligible to compete at the District Science Day. Tipp City students participating were (THS) Alexandra Abboud, Andrew Abboud, Brooke Bowerman, Chris Bruening, Megan Bruening, Steven Chaney, Alexandra Robbins, Briana Schultz, Hannah Walker; (TMS) Thomas Chaney, Evan Hood, Kyla Jones, Sammie Rowland, and Elizabeth Walker.

Of the fourteen Tipp City students, ten received superior ratings at the District Science Day and were selected to proceed to the State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 08, 2010, where \$2.3 million in scholarships and special awards will be presented. Those students were Andrew Abboud, Chris Bruening, Steven Chaney, Thomas Chaney, Kyla Jones, Alexandra Robbins, Sammie Rowland, Briana Schultz, Elizabeth Walker, and Hannah Walker.

Students presented with special awards were: Brooke Bowerman - American Society of Mechanical Engineers Award and \$100 savings bond; Chris Bruening - International Society of Automation Award; Kyla Jones – International Society of Automation Award; Alexandra Robbins - U.S. Army Award and U.S. Dept. of Health & Human Services Award; Briana Schultz - Battelle \$500 scholarship and Ohio Governor's Award of Excellence.

Tippecanoe Students Compete at State Science Day

Six Tippecanoe High School and four Middle School students competed successfully in the Ohio Academy of Science State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 08, 2010. Over 1100 students from across the state participated in the all day event with a total of \$2.3 million distributed as scholarships and awards. Students exhibited projects in science, technology, engineering and mathematics which they worked on from last September through February of this year. All ten students did exceptionally well with most receiving superior scores as well as earning a number of special individual awards.

Tipp City students competing were, from THS- Andrew Abboud, eleventh grade, Superior rating (39.5/40 points), Future Physician – Scientist Award - \$500, Ohio State University Biological Sciences Scholarship - \$500 (renewable 3 additional years), University of Toledo Science Achievement Scholarship - \$1500 (renewable 3 additional years); Chris Bruening, twelfth grade, Superior rating (36/40), Award for Outstanding Statistical Analysis; Steven Chaney, eleventh grade, Superior rating (39/40), received 4 year SSD pin; Alexandra Robbins, eleventh grade, Excellent rating; Briana Schultz, twelfth grade, Superior rating (36/40); and Hannah Walker, tenth grade, (36/40); from TMS - Thomas Chaney, sixth grade, Superior rating (36/40); Kyla Jones, seventh grade, Superior rating (37/40), Outstanding Physics Project Award; Sammie Rowland, sixth grade, Superior rating (39.5/40), and Elizabeth Walker, seventh grade, Superior rating, (36/40), Milt Austin Aquatic Sciences Award, Cleveland Museum of Natural History's Outstanding Naturalist Award.

Tipp City Schools Take Top Honors At 2010 State Science Day

Ten students representing the Tipp City School District presented their scientific research projects to judges at the 2010 State Science Day on Saturday, May 8 at The Ohio State University in Columbus. All ten students did exceptionally well with most receiving superior scores as well as earning a number of special awards.

While the students competed individually, their combined efforts secured the Ohio Academy of Sciences' "Harold C. Shaw Memorial Outstanding School Award" for Tipp City Schools, not once, but twice! Six other Ohio schools received the award, but the Tipp City School District was the only district to have both its high school and middle school qualify. Among the criteria listed, a school must have four or more students earn a superior score on their project.

The Tippecanoe High School and Middle School Science Fair Program is only in its sixth season. Coordinators for the program are at THS, science teachers Scott Snyder and Jim Moore, and at TMS, teacher Len Kenyon. The local science fair is supported by Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters, Inc. and its members.

Tippecanoe Science Student Goes International

Tippecanoe High School junior, Andrew Abboud, recently represented Tipp City Schools and District 10 of the Ohio Academy of Science at the Intel International Science & Engineering Fair (ISEF). The ISEF is the world's largest international pre-college science competition, which provides an annual forum for more than 1,600 high school students from over 50 countries, regions, and territories (only twenty-four from Ohio), to showcase their independent research and the chance to receive part of the over \$4 million in awards and scholarships offered at the event. The 2010 Intel ISEF was held May 9-14 in San Jose, California. Abboud's project studied the effects of ultraviolet radiation on enzyme activity. He was selected as a Finalist to compete at the ISEF after successfully presenting his project at the local, District & State Science Days earlier this year, receiving Superior ratings with almost perfect scores at each level.

At the end of the week-long course of competition, seminars and special events, the 2010 ISEF distributed Grand Awards by category and Special Awards from various colleges and businesses. Abboud was awarded a scholarship of \$5000 per year for four years from the University of Sciences in Philadelphia. As he was also awarded scholarships during State Science Day from The Ohio State University and the University of Toledo, Abboud will have several outstanding colleges to choose from as he enters his senior year at Tippecanoe High School next fall.
