Greetings,

It has been five years since we began helping students from K-12 at Tipp City Schools with their STEM related educational experience. Most of what we do is STEM program or grant related, however, administratively this year we received the required State of Ohio Business Certificate of Continued Existence, and we are no longer under the I.R.S. Advanced Ruling period, so our 501(C)3 Non-Profit Public Charity status is continued as well.

The Tippecanoe Science Fair continues to be successful. New this year was the inclusion of projects from several 5th graders, and the addition of Special Category Awards sponsored by a number of area businesses and individuals. Awards sponsored this year exceeded \$1800. Seven students went to the State Science Day, with four receiving Superiors, and one student was selected to represent our seven county district at the International Science & Engineering Fair in San Jose, California. Several students earned additional special awards or scholarships at District and State. Thanks also for the continued support from Tipp City Rotary and Tipp Monroe Optimists, and the researchers from Eurand, Inc., among many other organizations and individuals.

Likewise, the LEGO (FLL) Robotics Program is slowly growing. David Gaier was appointed by the school as Robotic Coordinator to assist in organizing teams and training coaches and parents, guiding them through the project development and competition process. Hopefully this will keep students in the program for multiple years as they advance to higher levels of robotics competition. FLL and Jr.FFL team reports are included elsewhere in this Annual Report.

As a result of continued community support, we were once again able to fund a number of school programs and purchases, including the TMS Math Counts competition, Robotics Teams, Family Math & Science Nights, and the Science Fair Program. We were also able to award a \$500 STEM scholarship to a highly qualified THS senior, Mr. Steven Chaney. Special thanks to our large corporate sponsors for their continued support – Emerson Climate Technologies, A.O. Smith Corporation, Goodrich, and D.A.R.E. Electronics, and individuals Chuck Powder and Amy Stueve for their generous donations.

We're planning our next board meeting for August 31st at 7:00 p.m. at the Board of Education building. Our annual membership meeting will be Wednesday, September 21st at 7:30 p.m. Details can be found on page one of the Annual Report. Please join us.

2011 Tipp City Schools Science Fair Results

On Thursday, February 17, 2011, the Tipp City Schools held their 7th Annual Science Fair for students in grades 5-12. Students from L.T. Ball Intermediate School, Tippecanoe Middle School and Tippecanoe High School completed and exhibited projects in biology, chemistry, botany, space & earth sciences, computers, zoology, microbiology, biochemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics, medicine & health and behavioral & social science. The 2011 Tippecanoe Science Fair was held at Tippecanoe High School where 15 students received a “Superior” rating on their project and are eligible to go to the District contest held at Central State University on March 19th.

Among those students receiving “superior” ratings, nine were given special awards for their high scores; from L.T. Ball: Alissa Buynak and Natalie Seeman; from Tippecanoe Middle School: Adam Buynak, Thomas Chaney, Allison Chitwood, and Sammie Rowland; from Tippecanoe High School: Andrew Abboud, Tia Miller, and Zach Robbins, with Adam Buynak receiving perfect scores of 40/40 points from each judge. Adam Buynak was awarded the Grand Prize of a DELL “Red Devil” Notebook computer. Andrew Abboud received second place, and the project team of Alissa Buynak & Natalie Seeman received third place.

2011 District Science Day

Ten Tippecanoe High School, Middle School & L.T. Ball Intermediate School students competed in the Ohio Academy of Science, West District Science Day, held at Central State University, Wilberforce, Ohio on Saturday, March 19, 2011. Tipp City students participating at District were (THS) Andrew Abboud, Zach Robbins, and Elizabeth Walker; (TMS) Luke Becker, Adam Buynak, Thomas Chaney, Allison Chitwood, and Samantha Rowland; (LTB) Alissa Buynak and Natalie Seeman. Of the ten Tipp City students, seven received superior ratings at the District Science Day and were selected to proceed to the State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 07, 2011. Those students were Andrew Abboud, Luke Becker, Adam Buynak, Thomas Chaney, Allison Chitwood, Zach Robbins, and Samantha Rowland.

2011 State Science Day

Two Tippecanoe High School and five Middle School students competed successfully in the Ohio Academy of Science State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 07, 2011. Tipp City students competing were, from THS- Andrew Abboud, Superior rating (40/40 points), 1st place award from the American Microbiology Association, \$250, Medical Microbiology Text Book, & invited to attend a microbiology convention; 1st place Future Physician-Scientist Award from The Ohio State University School of Medicine, \$500; Zach Robbins, Excellent Rating; from TMS - Sammie Rowland, Superior rating (39/40); Thomas Chaney, Superior rating (37/40); Allison Chitwood, Superior Rating (37/40), 2nd place, Governor's Award for Excellence in Agricultural and Food Science Research; Luke Becker, Excellent Rating; and Adam Buynak, Excellent Rating.

The Tippecanoe High School and Middle School Science Fair Program is in its seventh season. Coordinators for the program are at THS, science teachers Scott Snyder and Jim Moore, and at TMS, teacher Len Kenyon. The local science fair is supported by Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters, Inc. and its members. At the 2011 State Science Day the Ohio Academy of Science gave statewide recognition to the Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters, as a model of community support of STEM education.

Tippecanoe H.S. Senior Takes Top Honors at International Science & Engineering Fair

For the second year in a row, Tippecanoe High School senior, Andrew Abboud, represented Tipp City Schools and District 10 of the Ohio Academy of Science at the Intel International Science & Engineering Fair (ISEF). The ISEF is the world's largest international pre-college science competition, which provides an annual forum for more than 1,600 high school students from over 50 countries, regions, and territories, to showcase their independent research. The 2011 Intel ISEF was held May 8-13 in Los Angeles, CA.

Abboud's project studied the effects of ultraviolet radiation on certain bacteria. He was selected as a Finalist to compete at the ISEF after successfully presenting his project at the local, District & State Science Days earlier this year, receiving Superior ratings with perfect scores at each level.

At the end of the week-long course of competition, seminars and special events, the 2011 ISEF distributed Grand Awards by category and Special Awards from various colleges and businesses. Abboud was judged **** 1ST PLACE **** for the Intel ISEF Grand Award in the Microbiology Topic Category with a \$3,000 cash award. There were sixty-five projects in the Microbiology category and sixteen hundred projects overall. Relate this to an Olympic Gold Medal in Microbiology. In addition, he received 3rd place from the American Society for Microbiology, receiving \$750, and a subscription to the ASM monthly publication. Mr. Abboud will be attending the University of Pittsburgh next fall, majoring in pre-med.

Tippecanoe FLL Robotics Team – Report from Coaches Brian and Jenny Oskey

The FLL robotic season concluded February 12th at Wright State's Nutter Center. The kids from Tipp City did great at the FLL robotics state competition. For this tournament, we wanted to give each child a chance to operate the robot during the competition. The veteran crew, Logan and Colin, executed a flawless round. The robot completed all of the missions which we planned for. Then came a referee ruling which really soured the moment. It revolved around how we delivered the medicine and doctors to the patient area. It's a long story but let's just say that the last three times we did this in competition it was fine.

The team was very impressed with the competition at state. These teams were good.....really good. Although we didn't receive a trophy, we had a good showing. In the robot competition, we placed 18th or 19th out of 60 teams. We improved upon our project score and really impressed the robot judges with what the kids were able to accomplish for their first year. They were also nominated for "Programming" and "Innovation and Strategy" awards.

The three TCEP Jr. Lego League teams coached by Deb Fitzpatrick, Karen Purke and Martha Weaver have made great progress since their inception in September. All three teams have been meeting on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30-5:00pm during the TCEP afterschool program on the second floor of the former Tipp City Central School in a room used by TCEP program that has been converted to our LEGO team headquarters.

All three of the teams have completed the following activities:

Suggested team building exercises.

Learned about and discussed everyday medical devices.

Viewed numerous videos on robotic devices including arms and legs.

Painted the base coats on wooden robot cut-outs.

Worked on individual designs for the wooden robot cut -outs.

Created a collaborative design for the wood cut-out.

Worked as a team to create a team robot.

Learned the basics of LEGO interlocking building techniques.

Teams observed three different simple LEGO machines based on reference books and instructions manual found at the library and online.

Created their own simple machines using ideas from the simple machines they observed.

Redesigned their team robots incorporating a simple machine and basic interlocking building technique.

Created drawings of their robots.
