Greetings,

This is the sixth Annual Report for the Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters, and the end of my first year as your president. I am happy to report that our members and business affiliates are still supporting the cause with generosity, and as a result our students continue to benefit when it comes to STEM education.

Over \$3000 in lab equipment and classroom technology were funded and purchased during the 2011-2012 school year, thanks to a donation from Emerson Climate Technologies. We have also received an additional \$4000 from Emerson, and \$1000 from Regal Beloit. These funds will be used for equipment/technology purchases and other grant requests in the 2012-2013 school year.

We were once again able to fund a number of school programs, including the TMS Math Counts competition, Robotics Teams, and field trips to Edison's WE are IT for Girls, to the Wright State University Chemistry Department, and to see their scanning electron microscope. We also helped fund two THS science teachers' trip to a science conference to bring back new teaching methods for our students.

The 2012 Tippecanoe Science Fair provided over \$2000 in awards to participating students, thanks to Tipp City Rotary, DARE Electronics, researchers at Aptalis, Inc., and from many other area individuals and businesses. This was the eighth year for our local science fair program.
