Greetings,

The past year saw some major changes in the Board of Directors. Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters' founders and long time board members/officers, Dr. Charles Smith, Dr. Andrew Davidson, and Dr. Martin English, all left the board due to term limits. Thanks to them for their foresight in establishing this organization, and for serving it for so many years. Their seats were filled by three equally qualified individuals, Carolyn Rowland, David Werts, and Mackenzie English. In addition, board member Brian Honeycutt recently accepted a position in another school district. His vacant seat will be filled at the Annual Member Meeting in September.

Active Members voted to amend/update the by-laws last September, including the separation of duties for the secretary and treasurer (now two positions). The by-laws also now allow the board to appoint any Active Member in good standing to hold the offices of secretary or treasurer (previously this combined office was limited to board members). The Board appointed Katie Wahl as secretary and Martin English as treasurer.

In May 2013 we lost long time board member and immediate past president, John Smith to cancer. John graduated from General Motor's Institute in 1969 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He had a life-long career in material science. John will be especially remembered for sharing his expertise and quest for knowledge with the community by serving on our Board of Directors from 2006-2013 and as President from 2011-2013. John's vacant seat will be filled at the Annual Member Meeting in September. To honor his dedication to STEM education and interest in the Science Fair Program, a Memorial Fund has been established to support the Tippecanoe Science Fair. Please consider a contribution to the: "**John A. Smith Memorial Fund for STEM Education**", when renewing your dues this year.

Funding of grant requests for STEM education in Tipp Schools was at an all time high this past year. STEAM member businesses, organizations, and individuals gave a total of over **\$12,000** to fund field trips, lab equipment and supplies, classroom technology, and programs like Science Fair and Math Counts. Major corporate sponsors included Emerson Climate Technologies, Goodrich Corporation, Regal Beloit, and Aptalis. Not all of the requests were met through the STEAM Boosters. Tipp City newcomer, Abbott Labs, directly funded an additional **\$50,000** in new STEM related equipment, technology, and lab supplies at THS and TMS.

The coming year presents a milestone for the local Science Fair Program. On Thursday, February 13, 2014, the Tenth Annual Tippecanoe Science Fair will be held at THS. While this program has been a success here at home, as well as at District & State Science Days (see the attached committee reports), Tippecanoe holds the only such event in Miami County. It requires considerable work and some experience to conduct a science fair, which may be what's held the other local school districts back. In order to provide the opportunity to more local students, Tipp's Science Fair Committee has sent invitations to staff at each of the Miami County School District, to have their students participate at the 2014 Tippecanoe event, thus becoming the "First Annual Miami County Science Fair". Please consider participating this year, as a mentor, judge, award sponsor, and/or event volunteer. Contact Martin English for details.

2013 Tipp City Schools Science Fair Results

On Thursday, February 21, 2013, the Tipp City Schools held their 9th Annual Science Fair for students in grades 5-12. This event offered students a venue that promotes the development of creative thinking, research and writing skills and career motivation toward the sciences, all in one program. Students from Tippecanoe Middle School and Tippecanoe High School completed and exhibited projects in biology, chemistry, botany, space & earth sciences, computers, zoology, microbiology, biochemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics, medicine & health and behavioral & social science.

The 2013 Tippecanoe Science Fair was held at Tippecanoe High School where fourteen students received a "Superior" rating on their project and are eligible to go to the District contest held at Central State University on March 16th. Students receiving a superior at District may go on to the State contest held at The Ohio State University in May.

2013 District Science Day

Thirteen students from Tippecanoe High School, Tippecanoe Middle School, and L.T. Ball competed in the Ohio Academy of Science West District Science Day, held at Central State University, Wilberforce, Ohio on Saturday, March 16, 2013. Almost 500 students from seven counties participated in the all day event. Students exhibited projects in science, technology, engineering and mathematics which they worked on from September through February of this year.

All Tippecanoe students who received a superior rating at the Tipp City Schools Science Fair in February were eligible to compete at the District Science Day. Of those thirteen Tipp City students, eleven received superior ratings at the District Science Day and ten were selected to proceed to the State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 11, 2013, where \$2.2 million in scholarships and special awards will be presented.

2013 State Science Day

Ten Tippecanoe High School students competed successfully in the Ohio Academy of Science State Science Day held at The Ohio State University in Columbus on Saturday, May 11, 2013. Over 1100 students from across the state participated in the all day event with a total of \$2.2 million distributed as scholarships and awards. Students exhibited projects in science, technology, engineering and mathematics which they worked on from last September through February of this year. All ten students did exceptionally well with most receiving superior scores as well as earning a number of special individual awards.
