Greetings,

The Annual Report is our best opportunity to keep the members and the community updated on Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters activities and events. First, we welcome local parent and pharmacist Robyn Crow to the Board of Directors. Her family has been active in supporting our programs in many ways. A number of new members joined us this year, both individuals and businesses. They realize the importance of supporting STEM education in Tipp City.

Funding of grant requests for STEM education in Tipp Schools was at an all time high this past year. STEAM member businesses, organizations, and individuals gave a total of over **\$15,000** to fund field trips, lab equipment and supplies, classroom technology, and programs like Science Fair and Math Counts. Community support came from organizations like Tipp City Rotary, Tipp Monroe Optimists, Tipp Monroe Community Services, Tipp Foundation, the VFW and many others. Major corporate sponsors included Emerson Climate Technologies, UTC Goodrich Corporation, Regal Beloit, Precision Strip, BASF Inc., Tipp Eye Center, and Aptalis. As reported last year, Tipp City newcomer, Abbott Nutrition, directly funded **\$50,000** in new STEM related equipment, technology, and lab supplies at THS and TMS in 2013. This year, Abbot donated an additional **\$50,000** toward new technology in Tipp Schools.

Excitement continues to build for STEM education in Tipp City. So much so that the Tippecanoe Science Fair Program has evolved into something much bigger. Not only did the number of Tipp City students double in 2014, but the importance and benefits of the program were recognized by educators and employers outside of Tipp City. A partnership was formed with other area schools, colleges, businesses, professionals, parents and other interested individuals, to form *Upper Miami Valley Science Days*, a program to provide the Science Fair experience to all students in Miami, Darke, Champaign, and Shelby Counties. Fourteen public school districts participated the first year, with 150 students presenting their projects to local volunteer judges at three county-wide events. Over 50 students qualified for and competed at the District Science Day with outstanding results. Thirteen students from five schools were sent to State Science Day, earning several Superior ratings and additional special awards. We are expecting additional new schools and more students to participate in the upcoming season. Please consider participating this year, as a mentor, judge, award sponsor, and/or event volunteer. This was also the first year for the John A. Smith Memorial Award for Material Science. At the 2014 Miami County Science Day, the \$50 award was issued to Mr. John Laughman, Newton MS. Donations to the John A. Smith Memorial Fund can still be made to support this award which will be continued each year.

2014 Miami County Science Day Results

On Thursday, February 13, 2014, the Tipp City Schools held their 10th Annual Science Fair for students in grades 5-12. This year the educational event was different though. Students from anywhere in the county were invited to participate, thus creating the 1st Miami County Science Day. This event offered students a venue that promotes the development of creative thinking, research and writing skills and career motivation toward the sciences, all in one program. Seventy-one students from Tipp City L.T. Ball Intermediate, Tippecanoe Middle School and High School, Piqua High School and Bethel, Newton, and Milton-Union Middle Schools completed and exhibited projects in biology, chemistry, botany, space & earth sciences, computers, zoology, microbiology, biochemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics, medicine & health and behavioral & social science.

The event was held at Tippecanoe High School where students were welcomed by UMVSD Committee members – THS science teachers Scott Snyder and Jim Moore, and Dr. Martin E. English. Ohio State Senate District 5 Senator William Beagle congratulated the students and stressed to students, parents, and community members the importance of STEM education for today's students, to meet the needs of area employers who are searching for employees with skills in research & problem solving, communication of ideas, and strong work ethics. Also addressing the student researchers was 2010 THS valedictorian & science fair alumnus Briana Schultz, who emphasized the importance that participation in the science fair program can have on students contemplating a STEM career.
