Greetings,

The Annual Report is our best opportunity to keep the members and the community updated on Tippecanoe STEAM Boosters activities and events. A number of new members joined us this year, both individuals and businesses. They realize the importance of supporting STEM education in Tipp City.

Funding of grant requests for STEM education in Tipp Schools continues to be supported by STEAM member businesses, organizations, and individuals, providing a total of over **\$15,000** to fund field trips, lab equipment and supplies, classroom technology, and programs like Science Fair and Math Counts. Community support came from organizations like Tipp City Rotary, Tipp Monroe Optimists, Tippecanoe Masonic Lodge No. 174, and many others. Major corporate sponsors included Emerson Climate Technologies, UTC Goodrich Corporation, Precision Strip, Abbott Nutrition, J&L Wood Products, Hickory River Smokehouse, Premier Health, Cargill and Aptalis Pharmatech.

Last year we reported on the expansion of the Science Fair Program into other school districts and other counties. *Upper Miami Valley Science Days* reached 18 school districts in Champaign, Darke, Miami and Shelby Counties, with over 200 students presenting their projects to local volunteer judges at four county-wide events. Over 80 students qualified for and competed at the District Science Day with outstanding results. Thirty students from ten schools were sent to State Science Day, earning many Superior ratings and additional special awards. We are expecting additional new schools and more students to participate in the upcoming season. Please consider participating this year, as a mentor, judge, award sponsor, and/or event volunteer. We are also excited to report that the Ohio Academy of Science has granted our request to form a new district (District No. 1 comprised of the four counties mentioned previously), effective May 17, 2015, and that the new District Science Day will be hosted by Edison Community College in Piqua, OH. This was also the second year for the John A. Smith Memorial Award for Material Science. At the 2015 Miami County Science Day, the \$50 award was issued to Mr. Davis Featherstone, L.T. Ball Intermediate, Tipp City. Donations to the John A. Smith Memorial Fund can still be made to support this award which will be continued each year.
